Coach Mentors

Welcome back to our Coaches and Managers for the 2017 season. Without your efforts, and the passion you bring to your roles, none of us would be able to play football. The leadership that coaches provide is a key factor in establishing and maintaining a positive club culture.

With that in mind, the committee is looking to implement a new role of Coach Mentor for the coming season to assist coaches in the 9-11 age brackets. These mentors will be present at training to assist coaches to run sessions, to give advice and to demonstrate techniques (but not to run your sessions for you). We are very keen to help coaches so that they feel empowered to run their training with confidence, while improving

their skills and importantly so that their players have a great time playing football.

The committee has a goal to have every coach qualified with at least the Grassroots level, but preferably the Skills level (Ages 9-12). To help with this the Canterbury District Soccer Football Association (CDSFA) is offering coaching courses in February that we urge all coaches without formal coaching qualifications to attend. The courses will provide you with a great introduction to foundational coaching skills. The Coach Mentor will then be able to build on these skills to develop your coaching ability.
