This makes us one of the oldest sporting clubs in the country, and we love that we have direct connection via our community back to our founder Bill Brackenbury. Bill was a 16 year old in 1924, agreeing to enter a team in the local football competition and beginning a lifetime of being a volunteer and leader in community sport. The Football Canterbury premier men's competition is named for our founder and our champion team have set their sights on bringing the trophy home in the Centenary year.

We have lots planned to celebrate our Centenary, including a fantastic launch on the weekend of 23rd-24th March, a Gala Dinner on 15 June and a trivia night. ## HURLO HEROES: JIM FRASER

#### FORMER AUSTRALIAN GOALKEEPER AND FOOTBALL Canterbury Hall of Fame Member

I first set foot on the hallowed turf of Ewen Park as a shy nine-year-old in 1958. At that time, I had never kicked a soccer ball and had no idea of the impact that belonging to the club would have on my football career and influence that the coaches and my older club mates would have in shaping my future both on and off the field.

In those day there was no structured coaching courses and coaches were often a father who had a son in the team and who owned a car as many families did not own a car at the time. Most Saturdays teams were ferried to away games in cars that were overloaded with the teams.

The park was our home away from home and from eight in the morning till dark for the next eight years when we were in season, we spent the days playing down behind the goals at the river end before and after our games. Thursday night was practice night and as there were no on field lighting all the teams gathered at the top end of the field with the only lighting coming from a single streetlight on the opposite side of the road.

Cliff West, Dennis and Bluey Lawther the senior goalkeepers in the club always ensured the younger goalkeepers had some time in goals and showed us the basics of the goalkeeping position.



As we progressed through the grades and after our own match, we would hang around prior to the start of each game hoping to get a run with an older team.

Phil Brazier and Ernie King and other all age players always looked after us and encouraged the younger players, it was like having a team of older brothers.

Looking back the football was rudimentary compared to the standard of the present structured coaching, the balls were heavy and difficult to both control and kick. Ewen Park had a large downhill slope running down towards the river, which caused the opposition teams to shoot over the bar most time when playing down the slope. The canteen was a tent, and the dressing shed was an old brick building with one room and a shower with no hot water.

But to us the park was our Wembley, we loved it and I still get the same feeling walking onto the ground as I did when I walked on it all those years ago.

Our 1958 team is still in touch with one another a testament to the coaches and players who guided us through those years.

As a coach and coach educator I still try to provide players and teams with the same positive environment as I received when at the club. I have been fortunate in my career both play and coach at international level and this would not have been possible without the development that was provided by the club in my junior years. I am proud of my affiliation with the club and my preferred tracksuit top on a casual day is a Hurlo one I have owned for many years. I was blessed to be a part of the club and to have had contact with so many wonderful players coaches and volunteers over the years.

And it is very satisfying to see the progression of the club and the fact it is in good hands and still suppling the same opportunities for players of all ages as it moves towards the hundred years mark.

Hurlo always was and always will be a family club and I am grateful that I was blessed to be part of such a wonderful club. I along with my teammates are looking forward to the centenary celebration.



### Game Leader Program 2024

#### A great opportunity for our junior players to learn leadership skills, have fun and earn some pocket money

Are you (or do you know someone who is) between 12 and 17 years old, someone who loves football, and is looking for some weekend work? We have the perfect opportunity through our Game Leader Program. HPW has a great record of developing young match officials for the game through our MiniRef program that has operated for many years. In fact, our current Game Leader Coordinator started out as a MiniRef back in 2007!

Our program has produced many of the current CRA Referees, as well as giving our kids the opportunity to develop football and leadership skills, earn some pocket money and hang out with their mates at the park on the weekend.

Our Mini Ref program was such a success that it encouraged other clubs to develop similar programs, and Football Canterbury have now formalised this as the Game Leader Program. Our club was the first to begin a training program for Game Leaders.

#### What is involved?

To become an accredited Game Leader, you need to sign up here.

Gemma and Jackie will then start the training process (after an initial discussion) and appoint you to games.

- We will let you know about the information and training sessions (this is a short info session that if not compulsory, but you do need to attend a training session to be part of the program – this is a one hour session at Ewen Park).
- Once you have completed the training session you can be allocated to Little Lions games as a game leader.
- For games for U8s and U9s, you will first be allocated along with a peer mentor (partner).
   Each of you will be game leader for half a game and observe your peer for half a game. You will receive feedback from our Game Leader Coordinators and from your peer mentor.
- The Game Leader Coordinators will decide when you are ready to be a fully accredited Game Leader. From then on you can be appointed to games in your own right.





- Our experienced Game Leaders will be appointed to ul0s, ulls and ul2s games.
- We may also ask Football Canterbury Referees to appoint Game Leaders for u10s-u12s Games.

We will be continuing this process in 2023 and we already have many new keen young people who are signed up to join the program. But we still have room for more so please let us know.

#### Why is it great to be a Game Leader?

You get to watch football and run around on a Saturday or Sunday morning. You earn some pocket money. You get a sausage (or equivalent) and a drink from the canteen. You learn some great skills.

Last year we expanded our Game Leader program to cover u10-u12 games. This means our most experienced game leaders (and those who develop experience and show promise during the season) will also be appointed to these games. Lots of these games are on Sunday so we need to know about your availablitity.

We have a sliding scale of payment for game leaders for 2024, reflecting the time and responsibility:

- Little Lions (U6s and U7s): \$10 per game
- U8s and U9s:
  - Trainee Game Leaders \$10/game (game leader for a half, observe for a half)
  - Accredited Game Leader \$15 per game
- U10s-U11s: Accredited Game Leader \$20 per game
- U12s: Accredited Game Leader \$25 per game

During the month of March, Cooks River People gather for Wurridjal Festival to celebrate the strong communities and ecologies along the river. This year, Wurridjal Festival will be held from March 14 to April 7.

The festival marks the start of a season when thousands of mullet – known as 'Wurridjal' in Dharug – enter the Cooks River during their pre-spawning migration along the east coast of Australia. For thousands of years, the river was healthy and a source of food for Aboriginal people. Wurridjal Festival aims to reconnect communities with First Nations knowledge and care for Country.
