



 - Home and away, followed by finals, washed out games are rescheduled
 - 10 and 12 team comps will have double headers early in the season
- ✓ The "home" team is listed first in the draw – regardless of where the game is played
- ✓ Weeknight games and double headers possible for U13+
- ✓ You will need to report any incidents to the club as soon as possible


Training Allocation

- ✓ Pre-season training allocation operates until 31 March. Thanks for your patience with this preseason is always challenging
- ✓ Training allocations will be advised to age coordinators individual negotiations are NOT an option
- ✓ We are a big club so cannot offer a lot of choice in training spots
- ✓ We work on some key principles and only move around these by exception (Tues and Thurs for mixed and male, Wed for female, younger teams earlier; basically ¼ the field size for games for training)

Hot Tips

The Hurlo BBQ works best with 3-4 volunteers, one to take the orders and collect the cash and 2 to prep the food and cook. We request that people who help with the food prep and cooking are over the age of 16, junior helpers (under 16) can assist with the ordering duties.

Cooking should stop at 12noon. This is to ensure that there is enough time to clean the BBQ and wash up before the end of the shift. We now accept EFT and cash, with all sales going through the Canteen and a ticket being issued.

All mini refs who have refereed a game are entitled to a free meal from the BBQ






Check each week for changes and again on Fridays.



Scheduling of matches

- Allow for/Expect double headers particularly in 10 and 12 team comps (But also because rain, rain and more rain)
- Possibility of Friday night games, mid-week games and twilight games
- Some divisions (35/1 and 45/1) have been pre-determined to be Friday night comps
- Some others may have Friday night comps
- (35W/1, 45/2, 45/3, AAW1 (GMT), BBC)
- We have Friday night football at Ewen but only when our teams are playing
- We will need to have ground managers rostered on for these games and may ask the team for volunteers



Checklist for Game Day

- Know who is playing
 Make sure they know the time and location (WhatsApp or Team App equivalent)
- Populate the digital match sheet and submit the team
- Introduce yourself to opposition manager/coach and to referee (check it's the right game!)
- Check for jewellery, hair pins, shin pads etc.
- □ Have your digital match sheet organised early in DRIBL (we advise doing this before leaving home, even though you can do it on the phone app)


Field set-up and pack-up


This is a team responsibility (under the supervision of the Ground Manager).

- ✓ Check if you are the first or last game on any field and have your team organised to do this
- ✓ First game be at the field 45 minutes or more before the game (For senior men's teams this means 12.15 at the latest).
- ✓ Set up the field before any other game preparations (3-4 players on each net, remainder to assist with ropes, benches). Your game will be cut short if you are not ready
- ✓ Last game: pack up before any post game discussion/celebration/postmortem



Ewen Park set up





Team Bench (Technical Area)

- ✓ MAXIMUM of **TWO** TEAM OFFICIALS with a current season Team Official ID Card and wearing an official's vest (officials will have ID cards and must have them)
- ✓Only players actually participating in a game are permitted; and must be wearing a training bib and/or remain seated
- √The technical area is near the half way line coaches must remain with their bench and not pace up and down the field

NOT PERMITTED in the technical area:

- ➤ Non-playing members of the team (e.g. injured, excess squad)
- Additional Team Officials (only 2 allowed in the technical area)
- ➤ Players' or Team Officials' children, partners, friends
- **x** Dogs
- Club Committee who are NOT acting as a VESTED GROUND OFFICIAL



Officials –Ground and Team



The Ground Manager is in charge!

As we require one ground official per field, we ask you to identify a responsible person to also act as a ground official (esp for neutral fields)



Coach and manager must wear the lime green vests and their ID badges when in the technical zone

Gear & Equipment

Players

- Approved Club uniform during matches (shorts and socks issued via team managers)
- Playing shirts are only to be worn to and from and during the game (even if it is your own shirt)
- Must have shin guards & boots when playing
- Must have their own drink bottles NO SHARING
- NO jewellery (taping not acceptable); bobby pins are ok
- Only safety glasses allowed on field (letter from optometrist)
- No hats on field (apart from goalkeeper)

Managers

Allocate a number to each player and record it (we can enter this
in Dribl so that it appears on the match sheet)



Make sure you have email/mobile access



Game Day – Kicking off on time

- BE READY to take to the field at least 10 minutes before kickoff
- This means the following
 - field fully set up (if home team) at least 20-30 mins prior to the game
 - electronic match sheets completed (players selected, teams submitted)
 - players ready to line up
 - Equipment off the field
 - ID checks completed and referees paid
 - all jewellery removed
- Please do not wait for the referee to blow the whistle and then wande over to the field
- As soon as the referee walks on to the field your players should be ready
- To keep games running on time, referees may do match sheet checks and player checks on the side of the field – be available for this
- Referees cannot complete their check until you have submitted the electronic match sheet



Alcohol & Tobacco

- No alcohol inside the fenced/roped area before completion of last game
 - This means anywhere on the ground
- No smoking (or vaping) anywhere on parks/fields where organised sport is being played in NSW



Game Day – Referees

RESPECT for Referees

Respect officials

Accept decisions by officials – they are only human and can make mistakes.

We currently have a 30% non-return rate of juniors who take up refereeing each year, and that is largely because they cop abuse/commentary/inappropriate behaviour.

There are 50+ HPW players who are referees, and the majority of Assistant Refs are KIDS.

The best way to increase the quality of our referees is to have them stick around long enough to learn.



NEW Referee Payment System


Season 2024 sees the transition to a digital referee payment system.





Update 2 – Referee Verification

Due to the nature of automatic payments, there now need to be a verification step done by the reporter to ensure that the presence of the referee is verified.

A new tile has been introduced on the matchsheet that allows reporters to confirm the referee presence.

Either team/club reporter can verifiy each referee presnce up until a lockout deadline which is set by Football Canterbury







Update 1 – Forfeit Required

Raising a forfeit for a game is still allowed. However, please ensure that the forfeit is made by the deadline set by Football Canterbury.

Should you breach the deadline, the forfeiting club will incur the full payment amount required to pay the assigned referees.

FAQ - What if there are no referees?

- ✓ Teams must agree on a volunteer referee
- ✓ Convention is but not required that the home team offers one first
- ✓ Once agreed, this person has all the powers of an official ref (including issuing cards)
- ✓ Treat them with the same respect
- ✓ Must referee the whole match
- ✓ Good idea to have someone from your supporters willing to take on this role
- Don't agree to share this role between the teams
- Do not pay a volunteer referee

Game Day - FAQs

FAQ - When do we need an AWAY strip?

- ✓ In Season 2024, HPW will play in white and blue (blue/white harlequin jersey shirt s, blue socks and shorts)
- ✓ If you are the HOME team and there is a clash of jerseys (same colour) as the opposition, you need to wear the AWAY strip
- ✓ Our away strip are the Yellow/Blue jerseys
- ✓ Can be picked up from the Ewen Park Canteen
- ✓ Sign them OUT and BACK IN
- ✓ Must be returned washed and folded ASAP (someone else might need them)
- ✓ YOUR STANDARD HPW STRIP IS TO BE WORN AT ALL OTHER GAMES



FAQ - What if I don't have enough players?

- ✓ Consider borrowing (but do so with caution)!
- ✓ Forfeit RARELY but EARLY 48 hours before Kick-Off cutoff times must be observed
- ✓ Forfeits must be notified to the Competition Secretary (Sinead) at <u>competitionsecretary@hurlstoneparkwanderers.com.au</u>
- ✓ The club is fined for late forfeits so please make sure
 you let Sinead know (the forfeit notification must come
 from a club official) even though Dribl will let you do it
- ✓ Must have at least 7 of your own players at all times for 11 a side games
- ✓ At least 7 of your own players on the field at all times or you forfeit



FAQ - Who can I borrow?

You can borrow:

- ✓ from a lower division in same age group
- √ AA/035/O45/050 players cannot play into different age groups
- ✓ Special rules for borrowing for women's teams

Saturday players cannot play in Sunday teams and vice versa

Players can play 'up' a maximum of 4 times in total – on the 5th occasion that is their team for ever (and they must have a card for that team to play with them)





Disciplinary Matters

Code of Conduct

By registering to play with Hurlstone Park Wanderers you agree to abide by the player's code of conduct and all the disciplinary procedures of the club. The disciplinary procedures can be found here. Our club takes our excellent disciplinary record very seriously. The aim of our disciplinary procedures and policies is to encourage all players and teams to take responsibility for on and off field behaviour.



As a member of Hurlstone Park Wanderers Football Club (player, volunteer, team official, parent or supporter), I pledge that I will uphold the values of the club in all my conduct related to football to promote playing football in a fun, inclusive and safe environment with respect for all involved in the

As a member or supporter of a Hurlstone Park Wanderers team I will abide by all the laws of the game and of the Football Canterbury Association.

- · I will always play by the rules
- . I will never argue with an official. If I disagree with a decision I will inform the captain, coach or manager during a break or after the competition
- . I will control my temper. I understand that verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players and deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport
- . I will work equally hard for myself and /or my team
- . I will be a good sport and applaud all good plays whether they are made by my team or the
- . I will treat all players in my sport as I like to be treated. I will not bully or take unfair advantage
- I will cooperate with my coach, team members and opponents
- · I will display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat
- · I will not arrive at the field intoxicated
- · I shall not consume alcohol at junior matches
- . I will respect the rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in the game, regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background.
- . I will thank the opposition and officials at the end of the game

I understand that any breach of this pledge or any misconduct will be sanctioned by one or more of

- · Warnings either verbal or in writing
- · Ejection from the field of play/stadium
- · A fine or suspension imposed by the Club
- . A fine or suspension imposed by the Canterbury District Soccer Federation
- · Expulsion from the Club
- And/or Legal proceedings

Disciplinary Process - What's new in 2024?

Red Cards

- A first red card will incur a fine of \$75
 which must be paid in person at the club
 canteen before the player can return to
 the field following suspension.
- Any second or subsequent red cards in the same season will incur a fine of \$100.




Disciplinary Process - What's new in 2024?

Yellow Cards


- Football Canterbury imposes an automatic one-week suspension on any player who receives 5 yellow cards within a season.
- Hurlstone Park Wanderers reserves the right to impose a one-week suspension on any
 player who receives 3 yellow cards within a season (second yellow cards within a game,
 which convert to a red card do not count to this total).
- Players who reach 3 yellow cards within a season will receive an email from the club to
 notify of the possibility of a suspension, and should they receive an additional yellow card
 within the season will need to show cause to the Club Disciplinary Committee why they
 should not be suspended.
- The Disciplinary Committee will take into consideration whether yellow cards were received for "football offences" or for dissent in deciding whether to impose the suspension. The aim of our disciplinary procedures is to encourage all players and teams to take responsibility for on and off field behaviour.
- Any team that incurs a total of 25 yellow cards within a season will be suspended by the club for one match. Team coaches and managers will receive an email to notify of the possibility of a suspension if the team reaches 20 yellow cards within a season and will need to show cause to the Club Disciplinary Committee why they should not be suspended.

HPW Disciplinary Process



Sin bins

- Applied for dissent to the referees (yellow card offence)
- 10 Minutes, with the time judged by the referee
- Can only re-enter at the discretion of the referee, on the request of the team official for the team
- The 10 minutes can carry over half time
- An offence committed while on a temporary dismissal will be issued with a second yellow card (=red card) and take no further part in the game



Incidents at your game

An incident is anything that causes concern

Behaviour issues from our own or another club

Send offs

Games being abandoned for any reason

 Arguments, fights, abuse of players or referees, offensive behaviour

- Police being called
- Complaints
- Serious injuries

 The earlier we know about these the better. You can ring Rosalie at any time to let us know, follow up with an email (we prefer to find out from our own club than from the Association or another club)



Abandoned Games

- If a competition game cannot be concluded (due to weather, safety issues, injury) the remainder of the game will be rescheduled by Football Canterbury
- Only players who took part in the original game (who were on the match sheet) can take part in the rescheduled game
- The game will play only the minutes that are remaining in that game
- If the referee or ground manager calls the game off for any reason, abide by their decision respectfully whatever the circumstance
